A RESOLUTION expressing the Seattle City Council’s support for workers at Starbucks in Seattle who are attempting to form a union, and urging Starbucks to accept card check neutrality.

..body

WHEREAS, union representation has important benefits for workers, particularly for workers of color, including better pay, benefits, working conditions, and job security. The Union Members - 2020 report released by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics on January 22, 2021 found that in 2020 “[n]onunion workers had median weekly earnings that were 84 percent of earnings for workers who were union members”; and

WHEREAS, on December 6, 2021, Bloomberg reported that U.S. corporations are amassing record profits, explaining that “third-quarter after-tax corporate profits from current production amounted to 11% of gross domestic product,” “more profits in the three months ended in September than ever before. Not just in dollar terms—something that happens frequently—but as a share of the economy”; and

WHEREAS, on October 28, 2021, Starbucks issued a press release claiming, “Record Q4 and Full Year Fiscal 2021 Results,” and “Consolidated net revenues of \$29.1 billion increased 24% (21% on a 52-week basis) from the prior year”; and

WHEREAS, on September 2, 2021, Gallup reported 68% of adults in the U.S. support labor unions, the highest approval rate since 1965, and 77% of young adults (18-34 year olds) support unions; and

WHEREAS, in December 2021, workers employed at two Starbucks locations in Buffalo, NY, successfully voted to unionize into Starbucks Workers United, an affiliate of the Service Employees International Union (SEIU), and are currently fighting for a first contract; and

1 WHEREAS, Starbucks executives are notorious for opposing the unionization of their
2 workforce, employing tactics that workers have described as “union busting”; and

3 WHEREAS, On October 13, 2021, WIVB, the CBS affiliate in Buffalo, NY, reported that
4 Starbucks “closed two of its Buffalo-area stores that are attempting to become the first
5 locations in the country to unionize”; and

6 WHEREAS, on October 29, 2021, CNBC reported that the National Labor Relations Board ruled
7 in favor of Starbucks Workers United, when Starbucks attempted to prohibit individual
8 stores from holding unionization votes; and

9 WHEREAS, on November 21, 2021, Bloomberg reported that “Pro-union employees have
10 alleged that in recent weeks Starbucks deployed out-of-town managers to visit their stores
11 and try to dissuade them from unionizing. The employees said they were pressured to
12 attend meetings in which company representatives warned that organizing could lead to
13 the loss of some benefits”; and

14 WHEREAS, the City of Seattle, as an employer, has long-standing policies of card check
15 neutrality, recognizing a union when the majority of a workforce signs union cards, and
16 committing to allow City of Seattle employees to discuss unionization free from threats,
17 intimidation, anti-union propaganda, anti-union meetings, and lawsuits; and

18 WHEREAS, baristas working at the Starbucks located at 101 Broadway East in Seattle’s Capitol
19 Hill have reported that they and their coworkers are attempting to organize into the union,
20 Starbuck Workers United, and have requested support from elected officials to demand
21 Starbucks “let the workers freely decide without any in terference, threats, or
22 intimidation”; and

1 WHEREAS, Seattle Starbucks workers are demanding a voice in their workplace and a seat at
2 the table to negotiate wages, benefits, and working conditions, health and safety
3 protections, adequate staffing, seniority pay, and a living wage; NOW, THEREFORE,

4 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE THAT:**

5 Section 1. The Seattle City Council supports Starbucks workers who are organizing to
6 form a union in Seattle. The Seattle City Council believes that this unionization drive will benefit
7 not only Starbucks workers, but all workers in Seattle.

8 Section 2. The Seattle City Council, noting that the City of Seattle practices union-
9 friendly policies in employment matters, urges Starbucks to do the same and accept card check
10 neutrality and allow their workforce to discuss unionization free from threats, intimidation, anti-
11 union propaganda, and lawsuits. If Starbucks workers in Seattle unionize, the Seattle City
12 Council urges Starbucks to bargain a fair contract such that the workers can have good standards
13 of living and the company's overwhelming wealth does not flow just to the top executives and
14 shareholders.

15 Section 3. The Seattle City Council recommends all workers in Seattle organize into
16 unions to collectively fight for better wages, benefits, and working conditions.
